HISTORY OF WEST POINT

George Washington realized the importance of West Point during the Revolutionary War when he decided to place the Great Chain across the Hudson to stop the British from sailing down the river. Later, in 1802, President Thomas Jefferson signed a law that made West Point a Military Academy.

The Father of West Point is Sylvanus Thayer who was the Superintendent from 1817-1833. He created high standards for discipline, grades, physical fitness and military skills.

Students at West Point are called cadets and after four years receive a college degree and are commissioned as officers in the US Army.

___ **Yearling or “Yuk”, Sophomore Year** You will get to select your major and also attend the Yearling Winter Weekend.

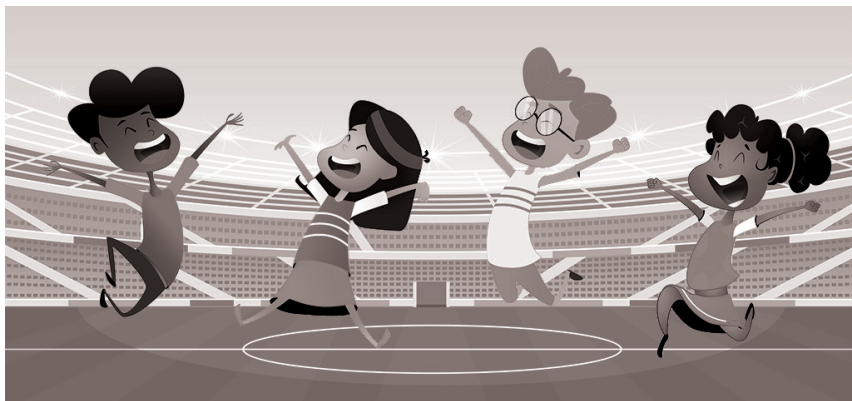
___ **Cow, Junior Year** You will take the IOCT (Indoor Obstacle Course Test) and attend 500th Night to celebrate 500 days until graduation.

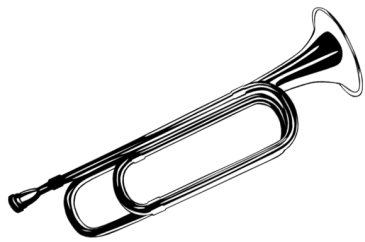
On, brave old Army team,

What college had the 1st class ring? West Point was the first school in the country to have class rings in 1835.

Where was Boodle hidden? Long ago, candy, cakes, and treats for the cadets were placed in the cannons on the parade field by their parents.

Who was Benedict Arnold? Benedict Arnold was the commander of West Point during the Revolutionary War. He tried to sell West Point to the British but his plot was foiled. He is known as a traitor.

Where did blackboards come from? The first blackboard in the country was used at West Point in the Department of Math.

What is Abner Doubleday, Class of 1942, known for? This Civil War General is known for inventing the sport of baseball.
